

PSII Guide to Transition to BC's New Graduation Program Exams and Curriculum

If by June 2016 the learner has...	Then they will...
completed English 10	write the English 10 exam by June 2017
completed Science 10	write the Science 10 exam by June 2017
completed a Math 10 course	write one of the Math 10 exams by June 2017
completed Civic Studies 11 or Social Studies 11	write the associated exam by June 2017
completed English 12, Communications 12, English First Peoples 12, or Francais Langue Seconde - Immersion 12	write the associated exam by June 2018
NOT completed English 10	write a provincial literacy assessment exam some time before graduation. AND receive an English 10 final grade that will not include a provincial exam mark.
NOT completed Science 10	receive a Science 10 final grade that will not include a provincial exam mark.
NOT completed a Math 10 course	write a provincial math skills assessment exam some time before graduation. AND receive an Math 10 final grade that will not include a provincial exam mark.
NOT completed Civic Studies or Social Studies 11	receive a final course grade that does not include an exam mark.
NOT completed English 12, English First Peoples 12, or Communications 12	<p><u>(IF ENTERING GRADE 9 or 10 IN FALL OF 2016):</u> write a provincial literacy assessment exam some time before graduation, even if Grade 10 English course has been taken and exam has been written.</p> <p><u>(IF ENTERING GRADE 11 IN FALL OF 2016):</u> write a provincial literacy assessment exam some time before graduation.</p> <p><u>(IF ENTERING GRADE 12 IN FALL OF 2016):</u> write the English 12, English First Peoples 12, or Communications 12 exam.</p>
<p>PLEASE NOTE: <i>It has not yet been determined if new literacy assessment exam and new math skills exam are to be tied to course marks. Details about how these exams are weighted toward graduation have yet to be released by the Ministry of Education, as of July 6, 2016.</i></p>
